### **AIR 50** **ESC Mixed Team Competition** **RULES**

The European Shooting Confederation has the great pleasure to launch a new team mixed competition for Air Rifle and Air Pistol to be conducted as a test event during the 10m European Championships.

#### **1.0 General**

##### **1.1 Participants**

###### **1.1.1 Countries / Nations**

Each ESC Member Federation may participate with one (1) team in each event/category.

###### **1.1.2 Categories**

- Junior Men and Women
- Men and Women

###### **1.1.3 Teams**

A team consists of two (2) shooters:

One (1) man and one (1) woman Air Rifle

One (1) man and one (1) woman Air Pistol

One (1) junior man and one (1) junior woman Air Rifle

One (1) junior man and one (1) junior woman Air Pistol

##### **1.2 Entries**

###### **1.2.1** The names of the participating team members must be notified to the Organizing Committee by the Team Leader two (2) days before the competition. Only shooters registered for the regular European Championships are eligible to participate at the "AIR 50".

###### **1.2.2** No entry fee will be charged during 2012.

#### **2.0 Competition Rules**

##### **2.1 Events and number of shots:**

###### **2.1.1** For all qualification matches:

10m Air Rifle – 50 shots by each shooter (no individual ranking, team results only).

10m Air Pistol – 50 shots by each shooter (no individual ranking, team results only).

###### **2.1.1.1** Random allocation:

The random allocation of team members to firing points may be done either by the drawing of the lots or with a computer program suited to this purpose.

2.1.2 For the Finals:

2.1.2.1 The four (4) best teams are qualified for the Finals. The final consists of duel matches without qualification match result.

2.1.2.2 The women team members must be placed in odd number firing points (1-3-5-7).

## **2.2 Shooting times (electronic targets):**

2.2.1 Shooting time for the qualification match:

**60** minutes for 50 shots including unlimited sighters.

2.2.2 Shooting time for the Finals:

### **1<sup>st</sup> stage**

1<sup>st</sup> team vs. 3<sup>rd</sup> team, 2<sup>nd</sup> team vs. 4<sup>th</sup> team

3 minutes preparation time, followed by 5 shots by each team members.

Commands: Load, Attention, Start

5 minutes for 5 shots

Announcement at the end of the stage

### **2<sup>nd</sup> stage: Bronze medal match**

Two (2) teams lost at the first stage

No preparation time, no sighting shot, followed by 5 shots by each team members, each shot in 45 seconds.

Commands: Load, Attention, Start

Announcement after each shot.

### **3<sup>rd</sup> stage: Gold and Silver medals match**

Two (2) teams won at the first stage

No preparation time, no sighting shot, followed by 5 shots by each team members, each shot in 45 seconds.

Commands: Load, Attention, Start

Announcement after each shot.

## **2.3 Ties**

2.3.1 Team ties will be broken as per ISSF rule (6.14.7.1).

2.3.2 Tied scores after the Finals will be broken by a Shoot-off.

## **3.0 Results**

3.1 Only team results will be entered in the ranking table.

3.2 The result is a total of the two (2) shooters.

## **4.0 Shooting Ranges**

4.1 The Qualification will take place at the qualification range.

4.2 The Finals will take place at the final range.

4.3 Special software for scoreboard.

## **5.0 Awards and Special Prize**

5.1 Awards

5.1.1 A Challenge Trophy symbolising the ESC "AIR 50" will be awarded to the winning teams (rifle and pistol).

5.2 Special Prize

5.2.1 A special prize will be awarded to the three top teams.

Men and Women teams: 1<sup>st</sup> 4000 euro, 2<sup>nd</sup> 2000 euro and 3<sup>rd</sup> 1000 euro
